Overall Objective:

2. To increase the capacity of the NGOs in supporting local and regional authorities in the field of water management.
3. To raise public awareness and strengthen public participation by promoting the protection of ecosystem and advocacy for pollution control in Black Sea Basin, especially the tributaries rivers.



Main Activities:

- Creating the framework for a better cooperation among NGOs and the other stakeholders in the field of water management and pollution combating including.
- Study on water management process within project regions with relation to EU regulations.
- Research on the role of NGOs in implementing Water Framework Directive and especially in River Management Plans elaboration.
- Creating a Cooperation web Platform.
- Strengthening NGO cooperation capacity.
- Developing human resources of NGOs.
- Increasing public participation into water management.
- Creating a database with best practices of public involvement on decision-making process regarding water and pollution control.
- Creating a guide on public involvement in the process of decision making.

- Improved and comprehensive knowledge on water management and pollution control status within project regions.
- Better outlining of possible NGOs role in environmental issue.
- Partnership tools created.
- Increased know-how transfer on water management and pollution control.
- Better dissemination of project information and results among different stakeholders.


