Overall Objective:

The project is aiming to promote the agro-tourism in the partners' regions and to improve the quality of the services provided by introducing a common specific quality standard and a certification process.



Specific Objectives:

- 1. To design and develop a common standard framework and to adapt it to the local specific conditions.
- 2. To design and establish a common assessment and a certification process.
- 3. To create a high level transnational group of experts that will be able to support the local businesses and to apply the whole process in the partners' regions.
- 4. To develop a pilot application of the standard and certification scheme in several enterprises in the agro-tourism sector that will improve their services and act as role models in their areas.
- 5. To exchange knowledge, experiences and best practices between the partners involved.
- 6. To achieve a strong interregional partnership and cooperation by creating a network that will manage the application of standardization process in the future and promote the initiative at international level.



Main Activities:

- O Realizing a study of the current status in the project regions and of the customers needs and expectations.
- O Realising a GAP analysis and a good practices research.
- O Developing a good practices database.
- O Designing the common standard framework.
- O Establishing local certification schemes.
- O Realising a common promotion plan.



Expected results:

- O 1 network of cross border partnership created.
- O 96 entrepreneurs / economic agents involved in the project.
- O 6 local administrations involved in the initiatives for capacity building.
- O 1 project partnership that establishes a permanent economic relation between the economic actors from different countries.
- O 90 entrepreneurs that adopted innovations and started new products.
- O 1 new permanent joint product.


