Overall Objective:

The project is aiming to contribute to stronger regional partnerships and cooperation schemes in the Black Sea area through the reinforcement of administrative capacities of local authorities and bodies.



Specific Objectives:

1. To reinforce the administrative capacities of local authorities and bodies in a very crucial sector (energy efficiency in buildings).
2. To achieve a major environmental and economic impacts both locally and globally.





Main Activities:

- Collecting and comparing Institutional framework at EU, national and local concerning energy efficiency issues focused on buildings construction sector.
- Collecting information about funding opportunities, programmes and political initiatives at EU, national and local level and evaluate them in order to meet the needs of the partners.
- Identifying appropriate best practices concerning energy efficiency issues.
- Developing a BSBEEP Pool of experts.
- Identifying building materials and systems concerning energy efficiency issues and uploading them on a special section of the site (BSBEEP Agora).
- Realizing an energy audit on energy consumption by applying conventional and thermo-graphic methods.
- Developing an energy consumption tool for building based on recent data and international methodologies.
- Calculating the carbon footprint (CF) at municipal level.
- Elaborating Action Plans for ameliorating the environmental performances.
- Implementing 4 Pilot Demonstration Projects of retrofitting actions.
- Elaborating and implementing a common communication plan.

Expected results:

- Organised knowledge and information about buildings efficiency exchanged and disseminated systematically around Black Sea area.
- Valid data and sound analysis on two fields of intervention (municipal buildings and energy consumption on municipal level) collected.
- Reliable base studies for short and midterm planning on energy efficiency matters developed.
- Target groups and wider audience trained and aware on energy efficiency matters.
- Sound project management with quality financial monitoring achieved and transferred to non-EU partners.

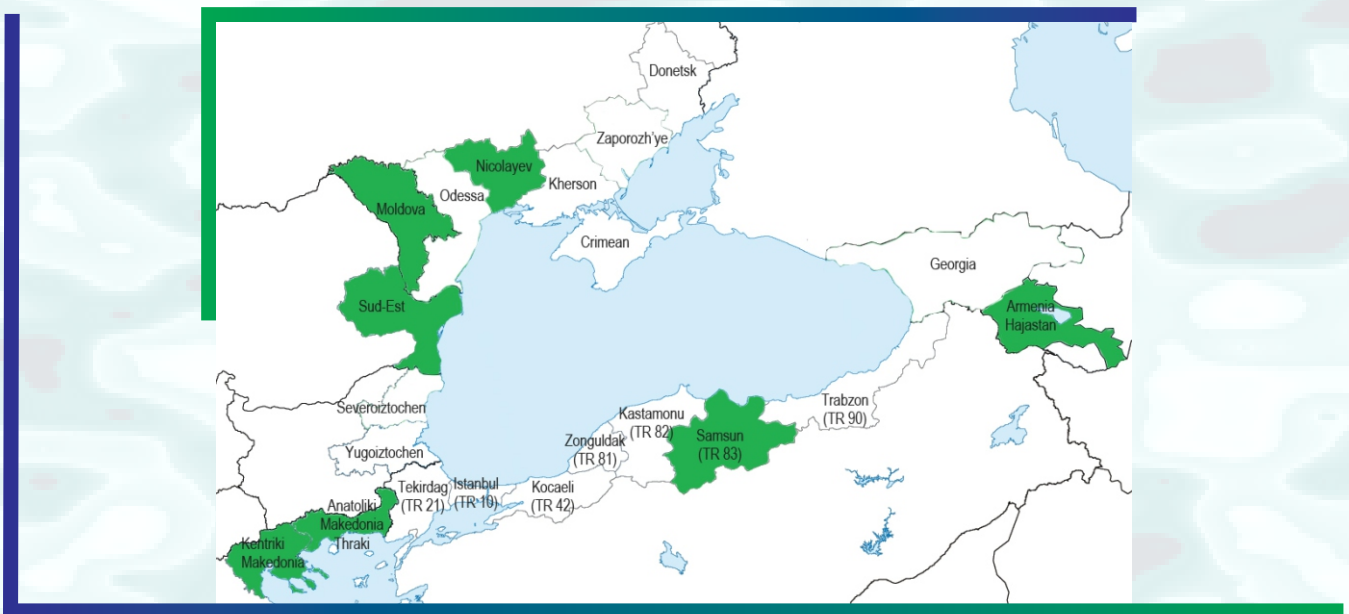
