- Community needs assessment for effective resource allocation for disaster prevention
- E-Learning Web Platform and a Common methodology to improve preparedness for emergency situations in rural areas
- Cross-border cooperation network in disaster management
- Capacity Building on disaster risk prevention and management for community resilience
- Reforestation campaigns for community mobilisation to plant at least 300 trees
- Emergency situation simulation exercises to mobilise the local population while facing the consequences of natural disasters effectively
