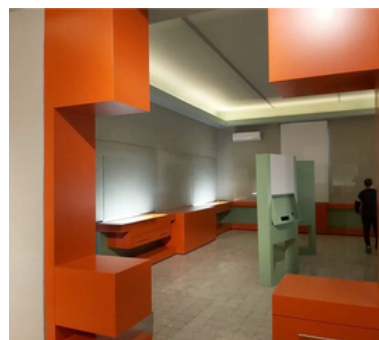
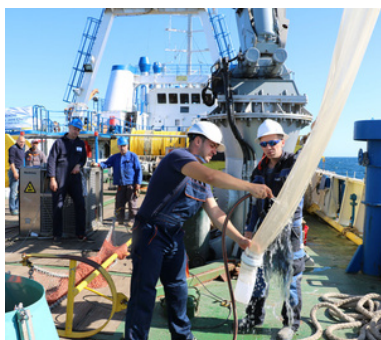
## Projects meeting original goals and being completed

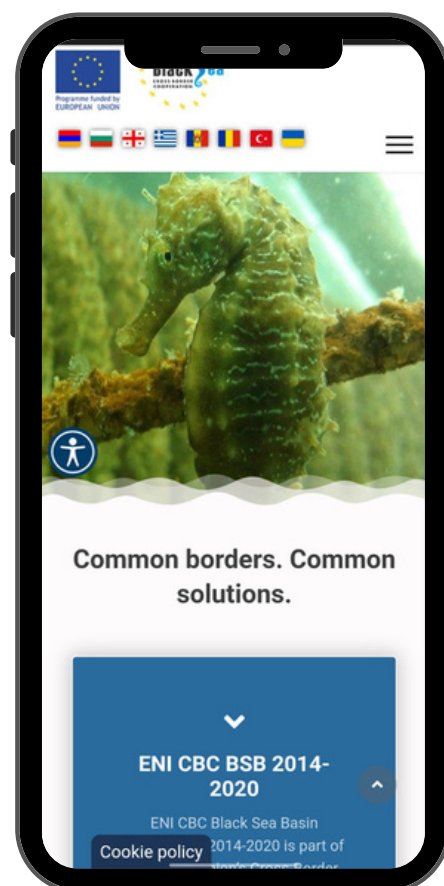
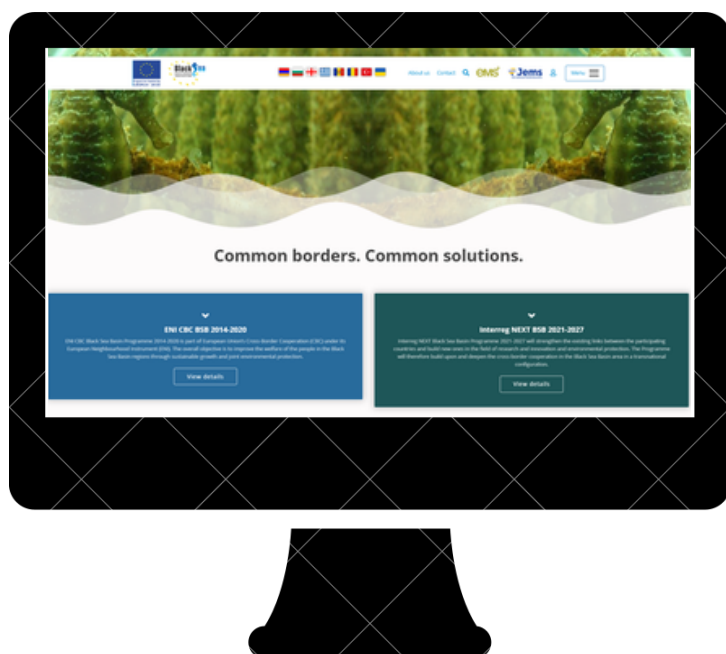

## What's NEXT?

### *Interreg VI-B NEXT Black Sea Basin Programme 2021-2027*

The Interreg Programme was submitted to the European Commission for approval on the 30th of June, 2022.

The representatives of the participating countries (Armenia, Bulgaria, Georgia, Greece, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Turkey and Ukraine) previously agreed on the final version of the Programme.

It is estimated that the European Commission will officially approve the Programme before the end of 2022, and the first call for proposals will be launched as soon as possible after the approval.
