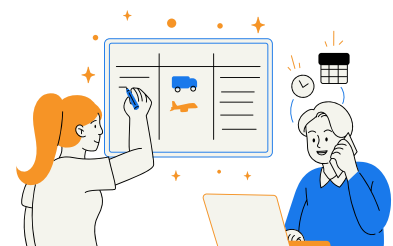

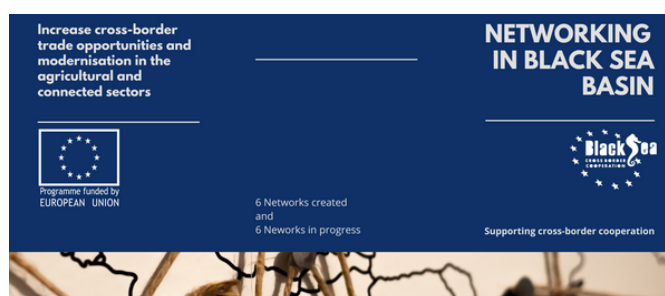
Along the way, several methods to promote the Black Sea Basin projects were used.
